I would love to see us all work together as a group on the November election to ensure a positive outcome in the ward races. However, I do not believe that this is possible and I think we should start to keep some of these conversations more personal and be mindful of who we are putting on which email chain.

This PAC was started to promote and educate people on Phase II, and everyone who gave their valuable time, energy and expertise were all valuable members to that specific cause. But I believe it is unrealistic to expect everyone to fall in line behind x, y or z candidate.

One specific example I am thinking about is my new friend, Lisa. She is the incumbent in Ward 2, and I personally am supporting her in this race. I do know, however, that not everyone who worked on the phase II

PAC plans to support her. There is, of course, nothing wrong with that. However, I am wary of conversations we have as a group benefitting someone who runs against Lisa. I think there has already been some sensitive information shared within this group.

If everyone can agree that we need to find candidates for wards 3 and 4, maybe we can focus on that.

My hope is that everyone can be transparent with their intentions regarding who they plan to support in the ward races, and also agree to keep any information that has already been shared within this group to ourselves.
